Planning	Waimanalo Advisory Council Plan needs to be revisited, reheard, and presented to HHC	 The Waimanalo Advisory Council Plan was not accepted by the HHC Recommendation: Issues related to Waimanalo will be addressed in the Oahu Island Plan process in 2012
Education	 Expand the scholarship program to include preschool keiki attending Punana Leo Eligibility should include Hawaiians not 50% living on Homesteads, similar to Chaminade's eligibility requirements Strongly support Internships and practicum 	 With an annual budget of \$200,000 and average of 100 recipients, the average award is \$1,000 or \$500 per semester. This is a substantial amount, but increasing the pool will lower the amount to be less significant Recommendation: No change to eligible applicant criteria Recommendations: Institute internship and practicum opportunities
Leases	 Transfer of leases needs clarification Sale of leases should not be for personal financial enhancement 	Refer to HSD and proposed rulemaking process
Agriculture	Crops and infrastructure improvements should be considered lessee assets	Refer to proposed Agricultural Program and proposed rulemaking process
Other	What's the difference between "Hawaiian Home Lands Trust" and the "Department of Hawaiian Home Lands"?	The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands was created by the State Legislature in 1961. The Hawaiian Home Lands Trust was a term used by the Hawaii Supreme Court in the Ahuna decision.
