ADDRESSING THE WAITLIST



- High infrastructure costs for units built in the last decade.
- Single-family units built in last decade resulted in higher mortgages to homesteaders.
- Few pastoral and no agriculture homesteads developed in recent years.
- The more successful we are, the longer the waitlist grows
- As the trust builds more homesteads, fixed costs go up.

KAUHALE PILOT PROJECT

- Kauhale were traditional homesteads of multigenerations that consisted of various structures that served specific purposes
- DHHL's Kauhale Project is a pilot being developed on Hawaii Island in Keaukaha and/or Waimea
- Pilot Project will assist DHHL in assessing beneficiary demand to reside in multi-family residential units that incorporate common living areas to be shared among a family.
- Goal is to move family in by the end of 2012.
- Contract Architect for Design of Kauhale
