Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalanianaʻole Piʻikoi Commemorative Parade “Ke Aliʻi Makaʻāinana – The Citizen Prince”

Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalanianaʻole Piʻikoi was the Founder of the Hawaiian Civic Club movement and proponent of the Hawaiian Homestead Act of 1920. In the early 1970s, parades honoring Prince Kūhiō were held in our island communities. Hawaiian Civic Clubs of Oʻahu would gather in the communities of Papakolea, Nanakuli, Kailua and Hawaii Kai to host this annual event, with a pageantry of floats,

equestrian units, marching units, and carcades of dignitaries...all in celebration of the life and times of Prince Kūhiō. Today, the activities to honor Kūhiō have grown from the humble parades in those early years to month long activities.

PURPOSE 2012

To honor the life and contributions of Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalanianaʻole Piʻikoi, founder of the Hawaiian Civic Club movement and proponent of the Hawaiian Homestead Act of 1920.

PARADE Fact Sheet

Car or Trolley Rental

Please note that your organization is responsible for your mode of transportation in the parade.

Floral Decorations

All participating units and their organizations are responsible for arranging and providing floral decorations for their automobiles. The floral decorations should be appropriate and easily placed and removed. Please be sure to work with the car owner to avoid any scratches or damages.

Participants using trolleys as their mode of transportation should include identifying banners along with floral decorations, which can be easily placed and removed.

Organization Banners and Car Signs

All participating units should be identified with a car sign placed on their mode of transportation or a banner as part of a marching unit. Units are responsible for recruiting members to carry their banners during the parade. **Car signs and banners may be ordered at your organization's expense from Aiea Copy Center, by Monday, March 5, 2012. Any orders after this date cannot be guaranteed for completion by the parade day.** Exception: A car sign/banner for new civic clubs chartered at the 2011 AHCC Convention. Contact Leimomi Khan for authorization at 808-372-0630 by not later than **March 10, 2012.**

Parking

Parking at Kapi'olani Park will be limited. We encourage everyone to either carpool or make arrangements within your organization to "shuttle" participants between designated locations. All on-street parking in Waikīkī is regulated and will be subject to "towing". Please read all parking signs and placards.

Halau Hula Performing Units

Musicians will be at four narration stations to play songs of your choice to which haumana may hula.

Health & Medical Needs

Once the parade commences, units will not be allowed to make any "restroom" stops along the parade route. All participants are encouraged to avoid drinking excessively before and during the parade. Should an emergency occur, immediately notify the nearest Parade Viewing Stand and call Leimomi Khan at 808-372-0630.

Attire

ALL participants and especially marchers are REQUIRED to wear proper foot attire. **(NO SLIPPERS OR OPEN TOE SHOES!)** Attire should be appropriate for the occasion and approved by your organization leadership. Avoid any derogatory, protest or political activism wear which would distract from the intent and purpose of the parade.

Music & Entertainment

All participants are encouraged to include in their unit Hawaiian music and entertainment appropriate for the occasion. Besides being an avid sportsman, Prince Kūhiō's love for music is evident in the Hawaiian Civic Clubs and the Hawaiian homesteads. We hope your unit will adopt the pleantry of music and song along the route in Waikīkī.

Float Entries

Should your organization decide to enter a float, arrangements should be made by your organization to easily assemble and disassemble the entry at the start and ending point of the parade. Because of limited parking space availability at Kapi'olani Park, we are unable to guarantee any space for disassembling your entry. Also, locations for constructing your float

as done in prior years near the Honolulu pier was restricted due to compliance and regulatory rules mandated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Liability

The Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, the City & County of Honolulu, the Hawaii Tourism Authority, and other coordinating agencies and associations, such as the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands will not be responsible for any injuries or damages sustained by any and all participants in this event.

Parade Starters-Monitors

On arrival at the starting point on Kalakaua Avenue, please have your parade representative check in at the parade station on Saratoga Avenue to determine your lineup position by 8:30 a.m. At the start and along the parade route, Parade Starters-Monitors will coordinate, track and ensure the flow of the units from the starting position at Kalakaua Avenue and Saratoga to Kapiolani Park. Please inform and ensure your units observe the following rules and restrictions:

- Parade ends at the intersection of Kalakaua and Kapahulu Avenues. **(NO NOISE IS PERMITTED ON MONSARRAT AVENUE.)**
- Vehicles and floats to disband on Monsarrat Avenue or, if available, parking spaces in the Waikīkī Shell Parking lot
- The last unit should arrive at the Kapi'olani Park area on or about 12:00 p.m.
- Once your unit has safely disassembled their decorations, ensure all belongings are secured. All float materials, decorations and items must be properly disposed and taken by your organization to a convenience center.

AT NO TIME SHOULD TRASH OR DECORATIONS BE LEFT AT THE PARK.
