## Assessment of Native Hawaiian Housing Needs

NORC at the University of Chicago (<a href="www.norc.org">www.norc.org</a>), a nonprofit social science research organization, seeks reliable, outgoing people to conduct interviews by phone and in-person within the homes of Native Hawaiian residents on the islands of Oahu, Hawaii and Molokai. The field period is anticipated to start early summer and last for 3 months.

This assessment, sponsored by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), will focus on the housing conditions and needs of Native Hawaiian families and help to inform policy and program development to address these needs. Interviewers will administer a structured questionnaire by phone or in-person which will take about 45 minutes to administer. Organization, good record keeping skills, and the ability to maintain confidentiality are required. Successful applicants will attend a paid training by phone. Attendance at assigned training sessions is mandatory. Materials will be mailed in advance. Interviewers will be well trained and supported by Field Managers throughout the field period.

Successful applicants must be available to work from 20-30 hours/week on a flexible schedule including some week nights and week-ends. Work hours will vary with the progress of data collection effort throughout the field period. Hourly rate is \$16.00. Mileage is reimbursed.

A valid driver's license and access to a car or truck is required. Knowledge of Native Hawaiian lifestyles is preferred. Census experience is a plus.
