DHHL's Land Use Process

 DHHL makes its decisions regarding land use designations in conjunction with its General Plan, Island Plans, Regional Plans and overall planning system on its entire 203,000 acre inventory.

DHHL's Land Use Process

For the Hoolehua region, DHHL has its:


- Molokai Island Plan, June 2005
 - Subject area identified as Community Use
- Island of Molokai Regional Plan, April 2010

To serve as guidance.

What homestead priorities in the Regional Plan fit Lanikeha Community Center?

- Economic development through open market opportunities.
- Community development through improved recreational facilities.
- Support the development of a community base to promote agriculture initiatives.

Where is this parcel?



What was the original intent for Lanikeha Community Center?

- The Lanikeha Community Center was constructed as a replacement facility for the deteriorated Molokai Recreation Center.
- To serve as a gathering place for celebrations and community events.
- To provide educational and social services to the community.
- To develop a certified kitchen to support Molokai's sustainable farming communities

What is the current status of Lanikeha Community Center?

- Presently there are no dispositions in place for management of Lanikeha Community Center
- Facility in need of repairs, renovations, and upgrades.
- The certified kitchen is in need of new equipment and repair to existing equipment.
- High use has created much wear and tear.

What is the current status of Lanikeha Community Center?

Existing tenants:

- Punana Leo o Molokai,
- Molokai Habitat for Humanity,
- Tutu and Me Traveling Preschool, and
- Alu Like Kupuna Program

What is Molokai Homestead Farmers Alliance requesting?

- An interim license agreement to start
 management of the center's meeting spaces
 and kitchen while they finalize their 501c3
 status and secure funding.
- Consultation process for a longer-term general lease for the facility
- Conversion to the long-term general lease for financing purposes

What does the Molokai Homestead Farmer Alliance propose?

- Repair and upgrade kitchen facilities.
- Repair to roof, windows, floors, paint, upgrade electrical.
- Install alternative energy technology.
- Establish the center as a Community Emergency Center for the Molokai Community.
- Establish a community business and retail incubator for the Molokai Community.

What does the Molokai Homestead Farmer Alliance propose? (continued)

- Continue to utilize the center for events, meetings, fundraisers.
- Hold workshops to bring awareness and education to the community.
- Potential Funding Sources:
 - Grant In Aid (GIA)
 - New Market Tax Credits

- Following input and discussion from you this evening, a recommendation will be placed before the Commission on April 21, 2014 whether to authorize a interim license with intent of converting to a longer-term general lease with Molokai Homestead Farmers Alliance per the terms we have shared with you on the merits and opportunities of this project.
