

Fact sheet on Kumu Camp

2004 Kaua'i Island Plan-designated the Kumu Camp project site as "Special District" and "Community Use".

2010 Anahola Regional Plan identified a "potential project" for a "Kumu Academy" retreat for Hawaiian organizations, cultural practitioners, kumu and homesteaders.

March 31, 2011 DHHL approved Community Based Recreational Use of Kumu Youth Academy (Kumu Camp).

December 1, 2011 Homestead Community Development Corporation (HCDC) submitted an Economic Development Grant Application for \$250,000.00 that proposed the design, finance, construction and operation of a kumu and youth academy at Anahola Bay.

2013 HCDC hired Planning Solutions, Inc. to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Kumu Camp Project to comply with HRS Chapter 343.

Per Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) 11-200-11, the Draft Environmental Assessment (DEA) and A Finding of No Significant Impact (AFONSI) was published in the state Office of Environmental Quality Control "Environmental Notice" bulletin for a 30-day public review and comment period.

October 2015 HHC Workshop on Draft EA—HHC requested additional due diligence.

January 2016 HHC issued a FONSI and requested consultation.
