Chair's Update

Nelson Case & Sufficient Funding

- 2007 Beneficiaries filed suit against State for failure to "sufficiently fund" DHHL operations
 - DHHL <u>only</u> state agency with constitutional mandate requiring the legislature provide "sufficient" funds
 - Hawaii State Constitution, Article XII, Section 1
 - 4 Purposes
- 2012 Hawaii Supreme Court rules Courts can determine what is sufficient for operating and administrative expenses
- 2015 First Circuit Court rules \$28M+ sufficient for FY15-16
 - 3/26/16 Court order amended to state legislature must comply with constitution and sufficiently fund DHHL's operating and administrative expenses this fiscal year.



PURPOSE:

The Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grant (NHHBG) Package Home Loan Financing Program was established by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) to make low-interest construction loans available to DHHL lessees in Kalamaula and Ho'olehua residential lots to construct a package home on their vacant lot.







 - Molokai Public Utilities (Molokai Ranch) appealed dismissal directly to Hawai`i State Supreme Court



Water & Environmental Programs


- Provides funding for rural communities to improve drinking water & waste systems and to promote economic development
- Can be utilized for <u>Potable Water Systems</u> ONLY
 - Cannot be utilized for MIS system
- Priority given to small, rural and low-income communities
- Funding Opportunities for DHHL
 - Grant maximum of 45% of total project cost
 - DHHL responsible for balance of 55%
 - Planning Grant \$30,000 <u>awarded</u>

DHHL Application to USDA

- Ho'olehua water system improvements have been approved
- Total cost estimate: \$22M
- Currently under design
- Construction to start by the end of 2018

Kanakaloloa Cemetery Improvements



- Includes paved roadways, perimeter wall, and open hale for ceremonial use
- Project went out for bid twice
- Both times the bids came in over budgeted amount
- Project and bids are under DHHL evaluation
