Please join us for a public education meeting on the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) water systems. DHHL owns four water systems – Ho‘olehua, Moloka‘i; Anahola, Kaua‘i; Kawaihae and Pu‘ukapu on Hawai‘i island. The objectives for this informational meeting are as follows:

- Increase awareness of the costs to manage, operate and maintain the water systems
- What DHHL is doing to keep costs down
- What’s included in the current DHHL water rate structure

“PWS” stands for “Public (drinking) Water System”. The identification number is assigned by the State Department of Health (DOH). Note: the DHHL Pu‘ukapu system is a non-potable water system; does not have a DOH identification number; nor is regulated under the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended.

We all know the importance of fresh, clean and safe drinking water. You have probably attended many different meetings regarding water issues. This time, you and your ‘ohana are affected directly. We hope you will take advantage of this opportunity, share your mana‘o, and perhaps, learn something new about your water system.
