

# Fact sheet on SOH/DHS youth services program

February 2008, the Hawaiian Homes Commission (HHC) approved License No. 705 to the State of Hawaii, Department of Human Services to run two Child Caring Institutions referred to as a “Safe House” in Kalaeloa Oahu and Wailuku Maui.

June 2008 Final Environmental Assessment for the subject safehouses are completed and posted without challenge.

2009 the Ke Kama Safe Houses in Kalaeloa Oahu and Wailuku Maui are up and operating.

2014 the Planning Department of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands published the Oahu Island Plan which designates the Kalaeloa area’s usage for Light Industrial.

2004 the Planning Department of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands published the Maui Island Plan which designates the Wailuku project area’s usage for Light Industrial.

April 21, 2018 License No. 705 expires. The HHC Chairman directs the Land Management Division of DHHL to gather beneficiary input through the beneficiary Consultation process before requesting the HHC approval to renew the said license.
