TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN

HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

PURPOSE: To increase the Federal Housing

Administration (FHA) loan limit in the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, to be seventy-five percent of the maximum single residence loan amount, for direct loans administered by the Department

of Hawaiian Home Lands.

MEANS: Amend Section 215 (1) of the Hawaiian Homes

Commission Act, 1920, as amended.

JUSTIFICATION: With the higher cost to construct or

purchase a home, increasing the loan limit from fifty percent to seventy-five percent of the maximum single residence loan amount will allow beneficiaries to purchase or make

improvements to their home.

Impact on the public: This bill protects the interest of beneficiaries of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, by allowing the FHA loan limit to be seventy-five percent of the maximum single residence loan amount for direct loans administered by

the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands.
