TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN

HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

PURPOSE: To increase the Federal Housing

Administration (FHA) loan term in the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, to be forty years, for direct loans administered by the Department of Hawaiian

Home Lands.

MEANS: Amend Section 215 (2) of the Hawaiian Homes

Commission Act, 1920, as amended.

JUSTIFICATION: Allowing for an increase in the FHA loan

term of direct loans administered by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands from thirty years to forty years, will allow for

the loan term to be closer to the loan term of the United States Department of

Agriculture's Section 502 Direct Loan Program, which is thirty-eight years and will also allow for lower monthly payment

amounts.

Impact on the public: This bill protects the interest of beneficiaries of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, by allowing for a forty-year FHA loan term for direct loans administered by the Department

of Hawaiian Home Lands.
