THE WATER POLICY PLAN OF THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION

In 2014, after two years of research and beneficiary consultation, the Hawaiian Homes Commission (HHC) passed the Water Policy Plan (WPP), the first comprehensive policy on how they would fulfill their water kuleana since passage of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act in 1921. The Vision, Mission, Policies, Goals, and Implementation and Reporting required by the WPP helps the HHC and Department determine when and how it will assert rights to water. Since 2014, progress has been made with beneficiaries on asserting the unique rights to water held by the HHC, beneficiaries and Department.
