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Legal Authorities

- Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) 10-6.1
- Native Hawaiian Development Program Plan (NHDPP), as approved by the Hawaiian Homes Commission (HHC)
- Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) 103D, Competitive Sealed Proposals or Request for Proposal (RFP)
- Various HHC submittals such as the annual DHHL Budget, Grant Award approvals, etc.

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Understanding the Rules

We begin our journey with the Native Hawaiian Development Program Plan

governed by Hawaii Administrative Rules 10.6-1, and APPROVED by the Hawaiian Homes Commission every two years

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NHDPP Purpose

Per Hawaii Administrative Rules 10-6.1:

To improve the general welfare and condition of native Hawaiians through educational, economic, political, social, cultural, and other programs.

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Native Hawaiian Development Program Plan

Major NHDPP Sections:

- -- Individual Development
- -- Community Development
 - -- Grants
- -- HHC-approved NHDPP Resource allocation Sources: HAR allows NHRF, federal, state, other Uses: as described in the NHDPP

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


Tip: Successful grant proposal

- --- Follows the instructions and answers the questions
- --- Is well written
- --- Proposed Scope, Budget, Work Plan, Timeline are aligned
- --- Project team is qualified
- -- Proposed project has broad community support

Step 1. Read instructions


Step 2. Follow the instructions

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Types of DHHL Grants

Grants come in all shapes and sizes Last year (2024), 3 Grants were available:

- Capacity Building \$20,000 maximum per application
 Total funding available Statewide: \$200,000
- Project Implementation -- \$200,000 maximum per application
 Total funding available Statewide: \$800,000
- Existing facilities in existing homesteads -- \$500,000 per application Total funding available Statewide: \$3,500,000

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State Procurement

DHHL Grants mirror the State Procurement Method

"State Competitive Sealed Proposals or Request for Proposals (RFP)"

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State Competitive Sealed Proposal steps

Minimum required steps:

- Step 1. DHHL publicly releases State solicitation RFP notice.
- Step 2. DHHL conducts application orientation sessions
- Step 3. Applicants may submit written questions.
- Step 4. DHHL is required to respond to questions and make amendments to the RFP, as needed. All are publicly posted.
- Step 5. Applicants submit Grant Applications by posted due date.
- Step 6. DHHL reviews applications to ensure completeness
- Step 7. DHHL evaluates applications based on RFP criteria and scoring.
- Step 8. DHHL makes recommendations to the Hawaiian Homes Commission

Only the HHC can make grant awards.

- Step 9. Public posting online of awardees and 7 day waiting period
- Step 10. DHHL drafts State Contracts with awardees.

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Overview: DHHL Grant Application

How to Apply: Prepare Grant Application


Eligibility: 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation AND a Hawaii Compliance Express Certificate

Typical Application:

- -- Proposed project description
- -- Beneficiary support and participation
- -- DHHL Regional plan priority projects
- -- Project Team qualifications and experience
- -- Matching funds (Non-DHHL)

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Criteria and Scoring (2024) SAMPLE

- -- Organizational capacity 40 points
- -- Project readiness 30 points
- -- Beneficiary involvement 20 points
- -- Sustainability 10 points
- -- Match funds/In-kind 5 points (bonus)
- -- Is it a DHHL Regional Plan Priority Project?

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ask	Estimate
Pre-Application – Community Development Process	Your own timeframe
HHC NHDPP authorization	Every two years
HHC Budget authorization	Every year in June
DHHL releases Grant Solicitation notice Pre-proposal orientation sessions	September-October
Grant Application DUE DATE	December
DHHL Grants Committee Review	January
HHC for decisionmaking	February
Notification to all Grant Applicants on HHC decisions	February
DHHL drafts Contracts for Grant Awards	March – April
Grant start date	July



Project may begin


Once State Contract is executed, Project may begin.

- -- Grantee PERFORMS Contract Scope of Work
- -- Grantee invoices according to the Contract
- -- Grantee grant compliance (reports, invoices/receipts, Hawaii Compliance Express, any amendments to Scope, Budget, Time, etc.)

Communication between Grantee and DHHL is CRITICAL during the Contract period
